Preface

Many criminal law casebooks focus on the theory and philosophy of criminal law. This casebook takes a slightly different approach. The authors have designed the book to help students develop the legal analysis skills necessary to address the kinds of problems encountered by lawyers who practice criminal law. The format of this book requires students to work beyond merely reading and understanding criminal law; students should move to the next stage of performing legal analysis by interpreting statutes, applying precedent, and advocating for different parties.

Suppose a client comes to a lawyer with a difficult legal problem involving a complex set of facts. The lawyer begins representation by performing the necessary research of the legal issues and finding a cluster of cases and statutes, usually from the jurisdiction in which the problem arises. To advise the client (and—if necessary—to litigate the case), the lawyer must analyze, distinguish, reconcile, and interrelate the authorities in the research cluster that represents the body of law in the jurisdiction.

One goal of this book is to recreate the lawyer's experience for law students by setting a task through an introductory Problem at the start of each chapter. Each Problem is followed by statutes and cases that relate to the crime(s) presented in the Problem. The statutes and cases follow a traditional casebook form, offering the student tools to resolve the Problem. The role of the teacher, then, is to help students identify the statutory and common law rules, find the rationale for those rules, and apply that new knowledge to the Problem. By placing analytical skill-building squarely within the doctrinal textbook and, by extension, within the doctrinal classroom, this textbook pushes students toward a deeper understanding of the material by providing them an opportunity to apply the knowledge they are acquiring throughout the course. Moreover, the chapters are ordered so that students will review material from the earlier part of the course as they move into more complex legal doctrine later in the course. We have placed notes throughout the chapters to help students think about the Problem as they are reading the material.

We have tried to select cases that have interesting facts, raise issues that tend to be central to the topic of the chapter, and that contain understandable—though not always "correct"—analyses by the courts. We have edited the cases with an eye toward making them readable and comprehensible for first-year students. In most

chapters, the main cases are all from a single jurisdiction (the jurisdiction in which the Problem takes place) and presented chronologically. Practicing lawyers generally focus on cases in the jurisdiction where the case is to be tried, trying to understand and reconcile them. We want our students to do the same.

This book is a tool for learning both the intricacies of criminal law doctrine and practical skills. While the materials enable the professor to explore the traditional principles of criminal law, greater breadth of coverage can be obtained from a good treatise or hornbook. We usually suggest that our students read Wayne LaFave, *Criminal Law* (6th ed.), which we consider the best of its kind. The LaFave *Criminal Law* material appearing throughout this work has been reproduced with the permission of the authors and West Publishing Company.

While we believe that the approach taken by this book is pedagogically sound, we have another, more selfish reason for using this approach in our teaching: it is more fun for the students to play lawyer than merely read about how other people have played lawyer. Our students agree, and we think this enhances their learning. This approach demands more work from them. They must read and think beyond the statutes and the cases to apply the reading to the Problem. We also ask them to prepare an outline of an analysis of the Problem, based on the authorities in the chapter. All this takes more time and effort, but they do it and seem to enjoy doing it. They know that they are reading the cases as a lawyer would, for a specific purpose: to resolve the Problem. We hope you enjoy it too.
