Preface to the Fifth Edition

The evolution of decedents' estates continues, illustrated by the changes to this series of casebooks, the first of which was published in 2006. The publication of the fifth edition corresponds with the introduction of artificial intelligence, an increasing number of individuals utilizing assisted reproductive technology, blended families, and alternative definitions of parentage, thereby acknowledging that a child may have more than two parents. While these changes seem to be issues related solely to family law, they impact inheritance, elective share, and often the distribution of trust benefits. Indeed, the interaction between family law and inheritance prompts a number of statutes and statutory revisions, including, for example, the Uniform Cohabitants' Economic Remedies Act (2021), the Uniform Parentage Act (2017), and the Uniform Premarital and Marital Agreements Act (2012), all discussed in this casebook. The Uniform Probate Code has also removed terms that it now considers outdated, such as "maternal" and "paternal" grandparents, distinguishing between "half-blood" and "whole-blood" relatives, and "genetic" parents. Language has evolved correspondingly with the law.

Societal and judicial developments also have found expression in recent legislation. For instance, the trustee's ability to "decant" one trust into another is now codified in the Uniform Trust Decanting Act (2015). Likewise, delineating the duties of a "trust protector" is now formulated in the Uniform Directed Trust Act (2017). Impartiality on the part of the trustee is better facilitated by the Uniform Fiduciary Income and Principal Act (2018). And the Uniform Powers of Appointment Act (2013) provides substance to an important tool of estate planners, often working in states that have very little statutory or case law on powers of appointment.

Other statutory enactments may be a result of the COVID epidemic, but regardless of the cause, they are garnering attention. For example, the Uniform Electronic Estate Planning Documents Act (2022), which relates to documents other than wills, complementing the Uniform Electronic Wills Act (2019), which has been adopted by nearly every state. And corresponding with estate administration in the digital age, there is now a Revised Uniform Fiduciary Access to Digital Assets Act (2015).

Not surprisingly, an increasing number of states have adopted the Uniform Trust Code (2000), which testifies to the greater use of trusts nationally and internationally. Working in tandem with the Code are the Uniform Probate Code,

revised in 2019, the Uniform Fraudulent Transfer/Voidable Transaction Act (2014), the Uniform Prudent Management of Institutional Funds Act (2006), the Uniform Principal and Income Act (1997), and the Uniform Prudent Investor Act (1994). Undoubtedly, an increasing number of statutes will be proposed to address the ever-changing fiduciary landscape.

Throughout this casebook there are illustrations of the impact of Americans living longer, and age never arrives alone. Increasingly, there are concerns over testamentary capacity, susceptibility to delusion, undue influence, and overall, how to ensure the client's true intent, as well as the professional responsibility of the estate attorney. Elder abuse has reached epic proportions, most often associated with durable powers of attorney, and guardianship/conservatorships. Attorneys must be cognizant of interfamily dynamics, how best to protect the estate from future litigation, and frankly, in this modern interstate age, which situs offers the best protection against contest and exorbitant attorney fees. Choice of law decisions prompt self-settled asset protection trusts, dynasty trusts, elimination of local taxation, and limits on contest by disappointed heirs. These issues are illuminated through the use of facts documented in cases provided in this casebook, cases that can magically transfer the professor and the student into a factual human situation that explores both the law and personal (human) options.

As we continue into the Twenty-First Century, any course on decedents' estates illustrates how the landscape has been transformed from testamentary transfer, to inter vivos trusts and the continuing proliferation of non-probate transfers, such as joint tenancy and contractual benefits. Another example of transformation is the easing of the "harsh formalism" of ancient formulae, the ability to disclaim inheritance and elective share through prenuptial agreements, and the ubiquity of health care directives and durable powers of attorney. The Rule Against Perpetuities is irrelevant in most states, made more so by the ability of estate planners to move a trust corpus into states that have abolished the Rule. Yet, surprisingly, today's new Gilded Age of wealth has generated calls for a return to the age of the Rule, limitations on the accumulation of wealth. And finally, those who remember the heyday of future interests are surprised to witness the discounting of the word "survivor," or also to permit the introduction of clear and convincing extrinsic evidence to change the plain meaning of words.

Some elements in decedents' estates remain the same. For example, separate taxation of estates remains among a few states, no matter what the federal outcome. Taxation has always been the tail that wags the dog, and this concern remains at the state level in many states, but at the federal level only among the uber-rich. And the human desire to make a difference in life remains the same, evidencing itself in philanthropic gifts, plus educational trusts for children, spousal trusts, and a myriad of trusts to provide "care, comfort and support" for everyone and everything,

including pets and mausoleums. Remaining the same, too, is a government's public policy seeking an orderly, efficient and fair administration of wealth transfers.

A final but inevitable factor, expressed in each of the four previous editions of this casebook, is the reality that at some point in time, each person who amasses wealth will become a decedent. No matter what legal changes have occurred, strategies adopted, or taxes imposed and paid, each person is amassing a decedent's estate that will one day transfer to others. In assembling the material for this casebook, choosing cases and Problems, writing Notes, and incorporating code provisions, a purposeful effort has been made to concentrate on the modern adaptations of inter vivos estate planning, but acknowledgement is made for what has gone before, plus the things that remain the same. Hopefully the users of this casebook will recognize and appreciate this balance in the following themes illustrated throughout this casebook.

First, my primary concern is to make this book a good teaching vehicle. To facilitate this, I continue to place a Tool Bar at the start of each chapter, hoping that this will allow for a brief introductory summary before entering the thicket of material. Often students miss the forest for the trees, and I hope that the Tool Bar will assist in providing a comprehensive overview from which the professor will be able to start, make reference throughout, and refer for a summary at the conclusion. Also, I have painstakingly chosen cases with fact patterns that invite interest, creativity, and debate. Good cases make good classes.

A second theme of the book is informational. While I do provide commentary and problems in the Notes, far more often the Notes explain, elaborate on the case, and highlight what is important. Furthermore, students and professors have embraced the Internet, which is even available during class. Therefore, this casebook has more than a few Internet addresses. Also, there are international references provided, furnishing a glimpse into such arenas as spousal rights and fiduciary administration in foreign countries. Finally, you will find a teaching device that may be used to teach some of the material — what is referred to as the "Analytical Principle." This is a tool, consisting of time frames and points of reference, which may be used to explain complicated issues such as lapse, pretermitted heirs and spouses, powers of appointment, class gifts, vesting, and the Rule Against Perpetuities. This device is explained in Chapter Six: Utilizing Future Interests, but its applicability will be illustrated primarily in Chapter Seven: Creation, Classification, and Utilization of Trusts. The Analytical Principle offers students a visual connection with the material discussed, it can assist in understanding in a spatial fashion. Should you choose to use it, it is meant to be a resource for understanding.

A third theme is the purposeful inclusion of excerpts from articles authored by national practitioners of decedents' estates. Many law schools and state bar associations are demanding that new attorneys have a familiarity with the law that makes them what is termed "practice ready." Current and prescient insights from women

and men practicing at some of the finest law firms and investment companies in the nation provide a glimpse into practice throughout this casebook.

The fourth theme inculcated throughout the chapters is statutory construction analysis. Too often students become imbued with a lopsided appreciation for the common law to the detriment of statutory interpretations. To address this, included within this casebook are various code provisions, including a number of state and uniform statutes, some from community property states. Of course, individual cases will discuss various state statutes in the context of decisions rendered. Admittedly, often cases were included because of the extensive discussion generated by a state's statute. Although the statutes may lack the factual context, including the creative drama of decisional law, they are the indisputable first step in any analysis of the issue presented.

This casebook is divided into eight chapters. Chapter One: An Introduction, introduces the student to the issues that will arise in the succeeding chapters. Initially, the "A Family Affair" concerns a typical blended family confronting death, parent incapacity, multiple forms of wealth transfer, and how the government, attorneys, and the family's personal decisions will interconnect. The family factually portrayed confronts a reoccurring dilemma in modern society — how to plan for incapacity, successfully transmit wealth to others, and address the consequences of postponing decisions. The first chapter is where the student is likely to be first introduced to the significance of non-probate transfers in the transmission of wealth, the struggle between state and federal tax entities, responsibility for caretaking, the distinction between federal and state taxation, artificial intelligence, and the possibility that attorneys may be held liable for negligence in preparing an estate plan. Eventually, when the book ends with Chapter Eight: Planning for Incapacity, we will revisit all the issues introduced in this first chapter. In the last chapter we will also introduce Medicare, Medicaid, Social Security, and the challenge of how to pay for longterm care for yourself or those for whom you accept responsibility. Increasingly, as is demonstrated in the first chapter, the goal of estate planning is to plan for what may be many years of incapacity and assisted living.

<u>Chapter Two: Intestate Succession</u>, is traditional, statutory, and yet very modern. If you died without making any arrangements for the transfer of your wealth, how would you want your property disbursed? Every state has an intestate statute defining heirs; this is both traditional and statutory. But extensive consideration is given to the changing definition of the American family; the 2015 introduction of same sex marriage is one illustration; another is the increasing utilization of assisted reproductive technology by persons wishing to become parents. The Uniform Probate Code has undergone a revision in part to codify the recognition that today a person may have more than two parents.

After establishing the pattern of distribution of wealth, when there is neither a Last Will and Testament nor a valid non-probate substitute, the material in chapter two explores how spouses, issue, and parentage status affect the distribution of wealth under intestate statutes. Science has increased opportunities for parenthood and heirs. Yet, who is an issue of whom? This is modern dilemma. And the most recent revisions to the Uniform Parentage Act, in tandem with the Uniform Probate Code, have introduced new elements. Although the concepts discussed in this chapter will have applicability to other forms of wealth transfer, this chapter provides the opportunity for students to discuss simultaneous death, assignment of expectancies, and disclaimers.

Chapter Three: The Last Will and Testament, details the traditional and modern application of the rules meant to safeguard a testator's intent. We will examine the different types of wills and then explore the formalities and intentionalities needed to execute each. These rules have deep historical significance, but technology, the preference for nonprobate transfers, not wills, and a less rule-oriented society have tempered the strict application of formalities. Instead, today, the rules are softened with doctrines of substantial compliance and primary intent. All of the pomp and circumstances of days-gone-by, with witnesses and lots of signatures in stuffy law offices, now may be reduced to a simple notary public signature. Progress? This is the chapter where we seek to balance the old against the new, the evolution of presence at execution, how much influence is undue, and in an aging population how do we define testamentary capacity? The cases illustrate the vagaries of the human condition. And once we have mastered valid execution of the will, with all of its competing interests, we discuss revocation and revival of revoked wills. So too, this chapter is very often the subject matter of bar examinations.

Chapter Four: The Meaning of Words, offers the opportunity to make a "fortress out of the dictionary." The law has accepted facts of independent significance, plus incorporation by reference. Likewise, extrinsic evidence may be admitted for latent and patent ambiguities. But legal lists and exoneration are evolving, as are ademption and accessions. Likewise, the law regarding contracts to make wills is fairly settled, but commentators have suggested, and offered legislation, proposing changes to the rules addressing mistaken plain meaning and the distribution of property when there has been a lapse in persons or property. Comparing the age-old rules with the new exigencies is like pouring new wine into old wineskins, precipitating good class participation. This chapter offers a chance to explore textualism and intent.

Chapter Five: Restraints on Transfer of Wealth, challenges the premise discussed in Chapter One—that persons have a right under the Constitution to pass their property to others at death; in Chapter Five we learn that there are restraints upon that right. For example, you cannot create a trust that promotes lawlessness, and you cannot mistakenly overlook your issue, marital or nonmarital. And since your spouse is also your economic partner, she or he is entitled to part of any wealth amassed during marriage, something that you cannot disparage without that spouse's consent. Constitutional rights form a good preparation for these restraints, such as the state's bureaucratic process that describes the cumbersome restraint

upon wealth transferring through the probate process. The costs, forms, delays, taxes, administration, and contests can be a bureaucratic nightmare. Finally, because spouses have a right to property amassed during marriage, we discuss elective share. The various models providing for augmenting the estate for election by a surviving spouse are meant to promote dialogue about public policy's deficiencies and the need for change. Indeed, the 2008 revision to the elective share provisions of the Uniform Probate Code, purporting to integrate marital property considerations into distribution of property at death, offers good discussion opportunities.

Chapter Six: Utilizing Future Interests, provides an explanation of the words, phrases, and constructions that have divided "vested" from "possession" for hundreds of years. Anticipating the next chapter, devoted exclusively to trusts, this chapter provides definitions, cases, and the Analytical Principle, which may be used to chart the interests that pass under anti-lapse statutes, class gifts, powers of appointment, vesting, and the Rule Against Perpetuities. Rather than study the material in a vacuum, the cases and statutes illustrate what is necessary to use future interests in estate planning instruments. Much of this material was discussed in property classes, for better or for worse, so what I provide here is the practical application of those words and phrases, applicable to trusts and what goes into them.

Chapter Seven: Creation, Classification, and Utilization of Trusts, is the longest chapter in the casebook, but the breadth and length seems justified to assemble all of the trust material in one place. Grouping permits a comprehensive approach to the topic. Because of the modern importance of trusts there are many statutes included in the chapter: the Uniform Trust Act, Uniform Trust Decanting Act, Uniform Directed Trust Act, and the Uniform Fiduciary Income and Principal Act, to name a few; the cases included complement the statutes, and practice concerns are emphasized with excerpts from leading practitioners in the field. Too often, courses on decedents' estates neglect to illustrate types of trusts common to estate planning. Instead, ten distinctive trusts are highlighted and five non-probate contractual arrangements that provide modern utilization, placing the material firmly in the context of what occurs each day in law offices and wealth management firms throughout the United States. Likewise, modification and termination of trusts have historical roots and, therefore, have rules, but more modern statutes have made substantial inroads, offering a discussion as to preference and, more importantly, professional responsibility.

Trust administration has become a career for many attorneys. Chapter Seven provides cases and materials considering what constitutes prudent performance, the duty of loyalty, reporting requirements, and how to maintain impartiality between income and remainder beneficiaries. And how should a trustee invest, repair, sell, or administer the trust property? These issues are discussed under powers of the trustee, and appropriate statutory guidelines are provided. Likewise, there is commentary from practitioners and scholars in the field.

Finally in Chapter Seven, three legal constructions, which rest upon the initial validity of trusts, are provided. These constructions are class gifts, powers of appointment, and the Rule Against Perpetuities. With class gifts and powers of appointment, it is possible to present the rules pertaining to definition, scope, and validity, especially with the introduction of the Uniform Powers of Appointment Act (2018). But the Rule Against Perpetuities offers a considerable challenge because of its changing status among the states. Speculation suggests that the Rule began to lose its binding force when states sought to ameliorate its harshness with doctrines such as wait and see, second look, and cy pres. Then, when states, and eventually the Uniform Probate Code, adopted the Uniform Statutory Rule Against Perpetuities, extending wait and see to ninety years, it was possible to imagine eliminating the Rule completely. Some states have done so, providing an opportunity to choose a favorable situs to utilize tax exemptions and unlimited duration, thereby enabling dynasty trusts or perpetual trusts. There is pushback against this, and material is provided so as to prompt discussion.

Chapter Eight: Planning for Incapacity, offers an opportunity to return to the Family Affair presented in the first chapter, and then to discuss options in light of what was learned between then and now. For example, identifying and locating documents pertinent to the estate, the utility of a will, the consequences of intestate succession, the necessity of using clear language, the avoidance of unreasonable restraints upon beneficiaries, and the use of trusts to provide for care and support. With that done, practicality demands assessment of resources and, specifically, payments from entitlement programs such as Social Security, Medicare, and Medicaid. And so as to provide for personal dignity and privacy, so as to ease the burden on family members, there are state forms and cases concerning durable powers, health care decision delegation, and the powers of conservators and guardians. The facts of these cases command headlines, and this chapter provides factual context. Increasingly, as Americans age, the issues presented in this chapter will dominate the lives discussed throughout the issues presented in previous chapters. None of us get out alive, and between now and then, we need to plan for incapacity and death.

The Fifth Edition of this casebook results in part from past contributions of Professor Michael T. Flannery, and the current contributions of Michael J. Hyatt and Samantha Winter, whose research and editorial assistance were invaluable. Thank you all.
