Because the author writes from a provincial city and is not an academic, the usual array of dozens of acknowledgments can be omitted from this text. I am indebted to three earlier books on the Tafts, Henry Pringle's two volume biography of *William Howard Taft* (New York: Farrar and Rinehart, 1939); Robert Patterson's biography of *Robert A. Taft, Mr. Republican* (Boston: Houghton Mifflin, 1970); and Ishbel Ross's *The Tafts: An American Family* (Cleveland: World, 1964).

Taft documents are assembled in D. Burton (ed.), *The Collected Works of William Howard Taft* (Athens, OH: Ohio U., 2004) (8 vols.); C. Wunderlin (ed.), *The Papers of Robert A. Taft* (Kent, OH: Kent State U., 2001) (4 vols.), as well as in J. Vivian (ed.), *Collected Editorials of William Howard Taft, 1917-1921* (Westport, CT: Praeger, 1990).

Archival research has been easier than for most biographical subjects. The Tafts, with characteristic modesty, consigned their papers to the Library of Congress rather than, as said by Charley Taft, to "a mausoleum someplace else." The papers of William Howard Taft's closest aide, Gus Karger, are at the Cincinnati Museum Center.

I am grateful to my wife, Anne-Lise Liebmann for her forbearance; to the President and Fellows of Wolfson College, Cambridge and the Cambridge University Library for facilities there; and to Joseph W. Bennett, Librarian of the Library Company of the Baltimore Bar, for securing some needed publications.
